Cleft lip and cleft palate occur when tissues in the baby's face and mouth don't fuse properly. Normally, the tissues that make up the lip and palate fuse together in the second and third months of pregnancy. But in babies with cleft lip and cleft palate, the fusion never takes place or occurs only part way, leaving an opening (cleft).

Surgically closing a cleft lip is simpler than repairing a cleft palate. The procedure is usually performed within three to four months after birth, and the scar usually fades as the child gets older. With a cleft palate, surgery is delayed until the child is one to two years old, when the upper jaw has reached normal growth.

A cleft is an opening. Babies diagnosed with a cleft lip or palate have an opening in the lip or roof of the mouth (palate). In some cases, babies may have both. Cleft conditions develop during the first three months of pregnancy when the tissue of the lip and palate do not fuse together completely.

Cleft/craniofacial patients typically comprise 25% or less of the orthodontists' practices. The presence of a university/hospital-based orthodontist was associated with higher rates of offering PSIO ($P < .001$) and an increased percentage dedication of their practice to cleft/craniofacial care ($P < .001$).
